#### Are We A Safe Place?



1983 in Louisville, Kentucky a national initiative known as "Project Safe Place" was established to benefit young people ages 13-17 with short-term residential and counseling services. What has happened over the past 32 years is remarkable as now there are "Safe Places" all across our nation that support children up to adolescents who are "at risk" or in a crisis situation. All a young person has to do is walk into one of these "Safe Places" and request help, within 30 minutes a safe place counselor will be on sight to assist him/her. If the young person finds him/herself in a crisis situation or feels "at risk" for any reason all they have to do is ask for help at a designated safe place. From designated schools, fire stations, libraries, convenience stores (Quick Trip in N.E. Oklahoma), to youth friendly businesses, a young person just needs to simply look for the sign (above) and they will know they are at a "Safe Place."

What about us? Are we a safe place? Let's get more personal. What about you? - Yes, You. Are you a safe place for people to come to you to find healing? What about your home? Is it a safe place? Is your home a safe place for your children to be real? Do other kids run to your home when theirs is in chaos? Is your family a safe place? Have you equipped your children to help other children or would you rather your kids keep to themselves? No doubt, this approach is safer and less messy. I mean, who has time to get messy with other people's problems?! Who wants more drama in their already over-dramatized life?

What about our church? Can people come to Central and know that we are a safe place where they can be real and find healing? What about your small group? (That is if you go to a small group and if you don't...you really should!) If a stranger came to your small group, would they have the freedom to be real and share about their crisis? Would they be embraced or would they be judged? Would your class immediately try to fix them by giving them advice or tell them to need to get professional help or would they be surrounded by your small group with love and acceptance? These are tough questions, but these are questions that need to be asked.

What does the Bible say? What biblical examples do we find of God's people providing "Safe Places" for people to heal? This will be the topic of my new Sermon Series in the months of May and June called, "Safe Place."

We have been talking a lot recently about our church becoming a hospital. What does that mean? What will it look like? How will it change the landscape of our church family? Are we going to "like" it? Is it going to help our church grow? Will it cause some people to leave? Will it be uncomfortable? Of all these questions I can only answer one with 100% certainty, it will make us all uncomfortable! But so does the true Christian life. Following Christ is not about comfort. It's about obedience.

Three things we desire as we head down this road:

- 1. That we provide a safe place for people to be real.
- 2. That we provide an effective process for them to find healing.
- 3. That we equip those finding healing to help others through the process.

I look forward to explaining more to you on Sunday morning about the future that God is leading us down. Many times before Jesus gave spiritual counsel, He took care of their physical needs. This is our way to take care of people's emotional and mental needs along with their physical needs as we share with them the good news of Jesus Christ. Jesus came to seek and to save all those who were lost. May we be found in the field doing His work when He returns.

Until the whole world hears, let's get on the road again!
