Dear Central.

Nothing short of a miracle and God's power can explain what took place in our worship services on January 24th. If you weren't here on the 24th, it is very difficult to explain. What started as a simple testimony of one person's sacrificial gift to help pay down our church debt, snowballed into nearly seventy people committing nearly \$70,000 over the next few months. If just those who pledged publicly during the worship services give financially, our church's debt will be reduced to around \$60,000. I believe that many who did not make public pledges at the time will join the rest of us to help eliminate our financial note once and for all. Again, what I witnessed last Sunday morning will never be forgotten. Furthermore, I have never seen anything like this before, but I do pray that I will see many things like it in the future.

Here is a simple truth. What we witnessed that morning was never about the money. It was about God's people getting in tune with God and each other to do something significant that we could never do on our own. One small child stood up and pledged his allowance of \$7.00 a week until the church debt reflected zero. How do you explain that? Wouldn't you call that "Radical?"

During the months of January and February we are talking about being "Radicalized" in our faith and walk with Christ. Let me tell you what we don't mean by "Radicalized." We are not talking about people being brainwashed so that destruction and death be brought against our fellow man. Instead, we are talking about having our hearts in complete tune with the Holy Spirit of God so that we might bring hope to the nations and salvation to all who will call upon Jesus as Lord.

I am so excited I can hardly stand it. I can't wait to see what God is going to do in our midst in all the areas that are included in this sermon series: From Stewardship, to Service, to Loving Relationships, to Faith, to Purity, to Discipleship, and then finally to Evangelism. What would happen if we got radical in all these areas? What would happen if we wouldn't settle for mediocrity or the status quo?

Just this morning I was reading out of John's gospel where Jesus said, "Therefore Jesus answered and was saying to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, unless it is something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner." John 5:19 (NASB)

If this was true about Jesus while He walked on this earth, what does that say about us? Why do we think we can operate outside of the power and guidance of our Creator? If you and I ever want to do anything significant for the kingdom, we must, and let me emphasize again, we must obtain our strength from the Lord. But the real secret is to discover what He is doing and join Him in that activity. It is there and only there we experience His power and become radical followers of Jesus Christ.

Let's get Radical!

Benevolence in 2015

In 2015, Central provided almost \$4800 towards rental assistance for 53 local families (partnered through Owasso Community Resources), almost \$9700 towards emergency utility assistance (320 local families) and fed around 200 local families in need with our food pantry. Barely 3 weeks into the new year and the need has already been strong! Did you know only .25% of our budget goes towards Benevolence? The rest is funded by your generous donations to the food pantry, donations collected at the business meetings or donations received though offerings.

Here's how you can help:

If you can help people in our community, please write "Benevolence" on your offering envelope to help with utilities for those with shut off notices in Owasso or Collinsville. Let's help our neighbors keep warm this winter! We also have the "SWORD" ministry that you can give towards which helps church members going through a tough time who need a hand up. If you would like to give an offering to be used to help one of our church families, write "SWORD" on your envelope when you give. We are constantly in need of household grocery staples (nonperishables) such as breakfast cereals/bars/oatmeal, boxed dinners, pasta and pasta sauce and as the need presents, we focus on an "item of the month" that the pantry is in need of. You can find this in the weekly worship guides, Central Scoop, signs by the donation bins in the Main and South foyer or here in the newsletter. Thank you Central for being a church that gives so generously towards this community!

Our preschool, Grand Central Kids is a great example of generosity. Miss Jana frequently has the children participating in Mission projects throughout the year. Just in these last few months of 2015: in October GCK collected 43 Peanut Butters and 41 Jellies for the pantry, November they collected 65 cans of fruit and in December the children collected 26 bags of dry beans, 22 boxes of cornbread and 33 cans of soup and January they just collected 46 canned meats and 18 other items! Miss Jana would like to invite the families of Central to help with a February missions project for Mission: Owasso. Now through February 18th, they are collecting baby diapers of all sizes (open packages are welcome) and baby wipes. You can drop these off at Miss Jana's office at the entrance to the kids hall.
